Can you buy a family ticket?	Yes event tickets – 2 adults, 2 children at £16.50 including booking fee.
Do babies need tickets	As space is limited babies in prams / pushchairs need a child ticket
Can I buy a ticket on the night?	We expect the tickets to sell out before the event.
Will I be able to get something to drink and eat at the event?	Yes. There will be a small number of food and drink concessions on site.
What should I wear?	The Garden Festival site is close to the water front and it is likely that it will be cold and windy. Wrap up warm and wear a good pair of shoes or wellies. It could be wet underfoot. Bring a torch and maybe an umbrella!
Is there parking at the venue?	There are a limited number of parking spaces at the venue and spaces will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Car Park charge – see below.
Is there a charge for There is a cost for parking at the venue of £3 per car/vehicle.	
Is there a charge for parking?	Charge to be made at the venue and CASH only. We do however encourage you to either walk or use public transport where possible. St Michaels Station is a short distance away and there is a bus stop directly outside of the venue.

Is there disabled parking?	There are a limited number of disabled parking spaces. These will be allocated to blue badge holders only. The same charge of £3 applies to these spaces.
Is there any free parking?	There is free parking at Otterspool Park and it will take approximately 15 minutes to walk along the waterfront or approx. 5 mins to cycle to the venue site.
